

### IOHN DOUGLAS JAMES (JACK) WATLING (31.07.62-21.07.23)



Jack Watling passed away on 21st July 2023, just before his 60th birthday, at Camden Hospital. Only a couple of months before, he and his wife Leonie had sold the Watling family home and packing shed in Bumballa Street, planning to make a new life on acreage near Mogo on the South Coast, with warmer winters than the Southern Tablelands and good times fishing and boating beckoning.

Since 1951, members of the Watling family had been orchardists and farmers in the Tallong area, then a highly regarded fruit growing region. Jack's grandparents bought a property on Kettles Lane they called "Homeley". Of their four children, only the youngest, Jack's father, James Manuel (Jim) finally settled on the property. After Jim's marriage to Fran in 1959, they bought "Glenrowan" fronting onto Caoura Rd. After the devastating 1965 Chatsbury bushfire, Jim was the only local orchardist to start again. Waiting for the trees to grow took a long time.

In 1988, Jim commissioned local resident and craftsman, Carl Zeschke, to make a fibreglass Big Apple which was attached to the front of the apple sorting shed where it became a symbol of the district's apple orchard heritage. Three decades later, after Jim's death, the Watling family gave the

sculpture to the people of Tallong as a memorial to both men. With funding provided by Goulburn Mulwaree Council, the Big Apple was restored by Alan Weston and the Jim Watling Walk was created in the Tallong Memorial Park by local tradesmen using material donated by Boral and Holcim. Jack, Jim and Fran's son, who had moved back to Tallong on his father's death opened the Big Apple in its new situation.

Jack Watling was brought up in Tallong, attending Tallong Public School and later high school in Goulburn. He remembered working in the orchard at weekends and school holidays, picking fruit and pruning trees. He paid for his first motorcycle with money earned from selling foxskins and his first car from his orchard earnings. After school, Jack left Tallong for work, finding employment as an apprentice motor body builder with Goulburn firm, WIFCO Pty Ltd and completing a welding apprenticeship. He married and the births of sons Tim and Scott followed. Later Jack joined the NSW Ambulance Service, becoming a highly skilled paramedic.

On Jim's death in 2014, Jack moved back into the family home in Bumballa Street and again became active in the Tallong community, including rejoining the Tallong RFS which he had first joined in the 1970s. He served as Tallong's Fire Captain from 2020 to 2022. He met Leonie and had a blissful trip around Australia with her. They married in the summer of 2022-23.

Then, when Jack and his new wife Leonie were ready to start their new life after a mammoth effort to clear the packing shed and family home, Jack became ill, finally dying of cancer. Despite his obvious discomfort and later extreme pain, Jack



was always helpful and cheerful, giving his time to pass on his knowledge of local history before he left the area. He will be greatly missed by all who knew him, and the community sends its sincere condolences and deepest sympathy to Leonie and all the rest of Jack's beloved family.

## PROPERTY PREPARATION FOR THE BUSH FIRE SEASON
